Two-color etching from two copper plates with chine collé 20" x 17-1/2"

The first plate is a spit bite aquatint printed in green. The second plate, printed in black, comprises line etching, sugar lift, lithographic crayon resist, burnishing, and spit bite.

The anthropomorphic character of the trees refers to the shared way in which, I imagine, organic forms converse.

On May 31, 1889, my great-grandfather, Harry Benshoff, was working in the family printing shop and bookbindery in Johnstown, PA, when the Johnstown Flood occurred. Over two thousand people drowned. Harry survived the flood by floating on a chicken coop, and lived another 74 years. My print was inspired by this family story and by the landscape of the region.
